- 1) Opening Statements (Niki Clarke)
 - Land acknowledgement
 - Introduction of new executive
- 2) Principal's report (Jesse Bemister)
 - Staffing:
 - Nootka's new permanent secretary, Rosemary Carollo, started this week.
 - A new Youth and Family Worker, Doug, has been placed on a temporary basis.
 - Nootka is still looking for an Indigenous Enhancement Worker, who will help support teachers in bringing more indigenous content to the classroom.
 - The school held a Remembrance Day ceremony, which was very well attended by parents.
 - Field trips have started, including drama, skating, and swimming. Looking for school-wide opportunities.
 - Student teachers have started.
 - The Great BC Shakeout happened in October and in May Nootka will hold an earthquake drill that will include reunification.
 - Sports:
 - Volleyball for intermediate students is wrapping up
 - Basketball (Grade 6 & 7) will start soon
 - Looking for volunteer coaches.
 - The monthly fruit and vegetable program has returned.
 - Guided reading groups have started across primary classes.
 - Primaries have started story workshops in a dedicated space.
 - The FSA has been completed for Grades 4 & 7
 - Winter concert on Dec 14th:
 - Primary in early afternoon (Div 19-11)
 - Intermediate in evening (Div 10-5)
 - Winter Break is upcoming.
 - Report cards will be changing in format 2023/4 and go back to 3 reports/year (fall, spring, end of year). Goal-setting and student-led conferences will continue.
 - Report cards will go home at the end of January 2023.
 - The newly elected School Board has put School Liaison Officer (SLO) program back up for discussion and eventual vote. This is being politically driven and public consultations are underway.

- 4) Fundraising update (Nori McMichaels)
 - Purdy's:
 - Goal: \$1500 and we've sold more than \$4000. The PAC receives 25% of what is sold.
 - Growing Smiles
 - Just under \$1000 has been sold.
 - Both current fundraisers close on Nov. 28th
 - Nori will pick up the Purdy's order on Dec. 11th and plants will arrive on Dec 12th and can be stored at the school.
 - Help is needed with pickup both before and after school on Dec. 13th & 14th (8:45-9:15 and 2:45-3:15)
- 5) Treasurer's report (Mary Andersen)
 - A proposed budget of \$12,290 has been developed.
 - Funds will go to various classroom funds, music, instruments, field trips, library & Literacy, resource & storytelling supplies, Kindergarten classes & centres.
 - The PAC is planning to put money aside for replacing ipads & macbooks as they wear out.
 - The school has some money that has come through donations that will be added to our budget.
 - The PAC has received a Gaming Grant of roughly \$8000 that has strict regulations around use.
 - Gaining access to the PAC PayPal account and Vancity accounts is ongoing.
- 6) Hot lunch update (Hung Nguyen)
 - Hung is organizing hot lunches and ready to go as soon as we can pay Munch-a-Lunch. Hoping to offer at least one hot lunch before winter break.
 - Vendors include: sal y limon, westcoast poke, kiddie foods, and more.
 - Open question: Do we want to run hot lunch as a fundraiser or just to provide lunches?
 - We need volunteers to coordinate and distribute the lunches.
 - A straw poll showed that most attendees were willing to pay up to \$10 for lunch once/week, but would prefer far less. Hung reported that most vendors are coming in at \$3-\$6.
 - Regular hot lunches will start in January.
- 7) Pizza fundraiser (Niki)
 - A lunchtime pizza fundraiser will be held Dec 9th.
 - Need volunteers for pickup and distribution. The pizzas will be picked up from Pizza Hut pre-packaged in individual boxes, but still require sorting and delivery to classrooms.
